

Where to find writers (original articles)

- Read books and articles
- Sermons
- Social media
- Exhibitions and conferences
- Networking and referrals
- Unsolicited writers (people who express interest)
- Events host a writer's workshop, club







Where to find writers (permission to reprint)

• Feedly

- Book excerpts
- Blogs/websites (specifically of individuals in your area of interest)
- Internet search on your area of interest (<u>www.churchleaders.com</u>)
- YouTube/podcasts



Take note when using permission to reprint writers

- Check permission guidelines
- If they do not respond to your 'permission to reprint' query DO NOT publish the article
- Find ways to barter (advert in exchange of article, links to their online platforms, features in multiple editions)
- It is possible to grow your relationship with these authors to write original articles



Working with your writer

- Know what you want (provide a writers' guideline)
- Communicate with them (saves time, creates relationship, sets expectations)
- Work to grow their writing skills (begin where they are).
- Pay them if you can (monetary and/or in kind sponsor lunch, workshops, cards, merchandise, etc.
- Give time in your planning schedule for back and forth with your writers
- Share a copy or link of published work



Keys to helping a writer rewrite

- Give your instructions in writing (tracked changes/comments)
- Be sensitive (they've put in time and passion)
- Always give positive feedback first
- Use gentle, positive language
- Give specific suggestions as to how the article can be improved
- Explain why the changes are important
- Give a deadline
